«Media Education for Equity and Tolerance» (2016-2018) is a project co-funded by the European Commission. It aims at promoting a critical and intercultural understanding as well as an aware use of media among young citizens in multicultural public schools and democratic societies. Through action research, MEET will give teachers and educators methods to make existing media education practices more inclusive for intercultural classroom work.
